Personal Items Stay comfortable by bringing: Baby wipes Bug repellant, such as Bug Soother Chapstick Deodorant Ear plugs	Cleanup Tools These tools have proven useful on river cleanups but are not required: Bolt cutter Bow saw and spare blade(s) Collapsible/foldable shovel or spade Come-along
Extra zip-lock plastic bags First aid kit and liquid bandage Hair brush or comb, pony tail holders Hand sanitizer Lotion Medications, such as personal medications, over-the-counter pain relievers, A&D ointment, and medicated powder Soap, shampoo, and conditioner Spare eyewear if you wear glasses and/or contact solution and contacts case Sunscreen (waterproof) Toilet paper Toothbrush, toothpaste, and dental floss Towel and washcloth	Crescent wrench Fence pliers Garden trowel (for getting mud out of tires) Long-handled net or "litter tongs" Multi-tool Pick axe Pocket knife Rope, camp straps, bungees, etc. Sledge hammer Tin snips Tow strap with hooks
